

HISTORY OF SIMCOE HALL

Simcoe Hall was founded in 1935, by the Women's Welfare League in response to human and health conditions during the 1930s. They stayed active in the 1940s and expanded their vision for a fair and equitable community in the 1950's. The Women's League started what is now known as the Grandview Children's Centre and Eastview Boy's and Girl's Club.



MISSION AND VISION

We strive to provide wellness opportunities through our food bank and programs to serve individuals, children, and families in the Durham Region who experience financial and social challenges. We aspire to be a part of a community that allows everyone to experience and lead healthy, meaningful, and socially responsible lives.



FOOD SECURITY SUPPORTS

We are the largest food bank in the Durham Region, serving thousands of people monthly. Simcoe Hall's food bank is currently open three days a week. We also offer a Holiday Hamper program during the month of December, which provides people in need with food for the holiday season.



CHILDREN AND YOUTH

Simcoe Hall's After School Program provides children in the community with an opportunity to explore interests and recreational programming in a safe and secure space. Our Sun Fun Summer Camp offers children a summer camp experience with memories that will last a lifetime!



SENIORS PROGRAM

Simcoe Hall started the community's first recreation and leisure program for senior citizens. We now operate our Seniors Club, which meets once a week year-round. This program allows seniors to make meaningful social connections, maintain and learn new skills and engage in recreational activities.
