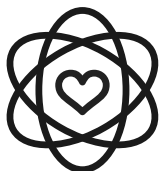

CORE VALUES

HISTORY OF SIMCOE HALL

Simcoe Hall was founded in 1935, by the Women's Welfare League in response to human and health conditions during the 1930s. They stayed active in the 1940s and expanded their vision for a fair and equitable community in the 1950's. The Women's League started what is now known as the Grandview Children's Centre and Eastview Boy's and Girl's Club.



MISSION AND VISION

We strive to provide wellness opportunities through our food bank and programs to serve individuals, children, and families in the Durham Region who experience financial and social challenges. We aspire to be a part of a community that allows everyone to experience and lead healthy, meaningful, and socially responsible lives.



FOOD SECURITY SUPPORTS

Simcoe Hall operates the largest food bank in Durham Region, serving more than 3,000 people each month. Our food bank is open three days a week, providing essential support to individuals and families facing financial hardship. In addition to our regular services, we offer a Holiday Hamper Program each December, providing people in need with food and essential items to help make the holiday season a little brighter.



CHILDREN AND YOUTH

Providing a safe and supportive space, Simcoe Hall's After School Program offers children educational support, including homework help and literacy programs, alongside engaging recreational activities and a hot, homemade dinner each day. Through the Youth Ambassador Program, older youth develop leadership skills while mentoring younger participants, fostering confidence, responsibility, and community connection.



SENIORS PROGRAM

The community's first recreation and leisure program for senior citizens began at Simcoe Hall, and today our Seniors Club meets every Friday for 10 months of the year. This welcoming program provides older adults with opportunities to build meaningful social connections, maintain and learn new skills, and participate in recreational and wellness activities that promote healthy, active aging.
